We believe that every child has the right to grow up in a loving family and all our services work towards achieving this aim. St David's Ethos

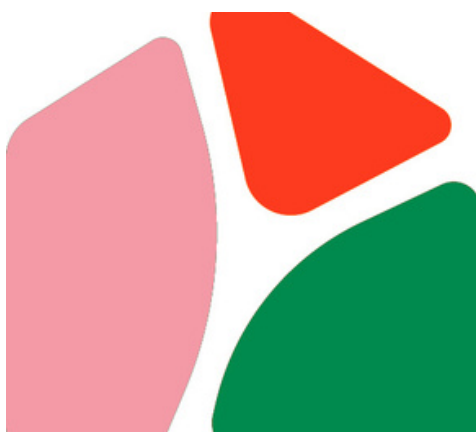

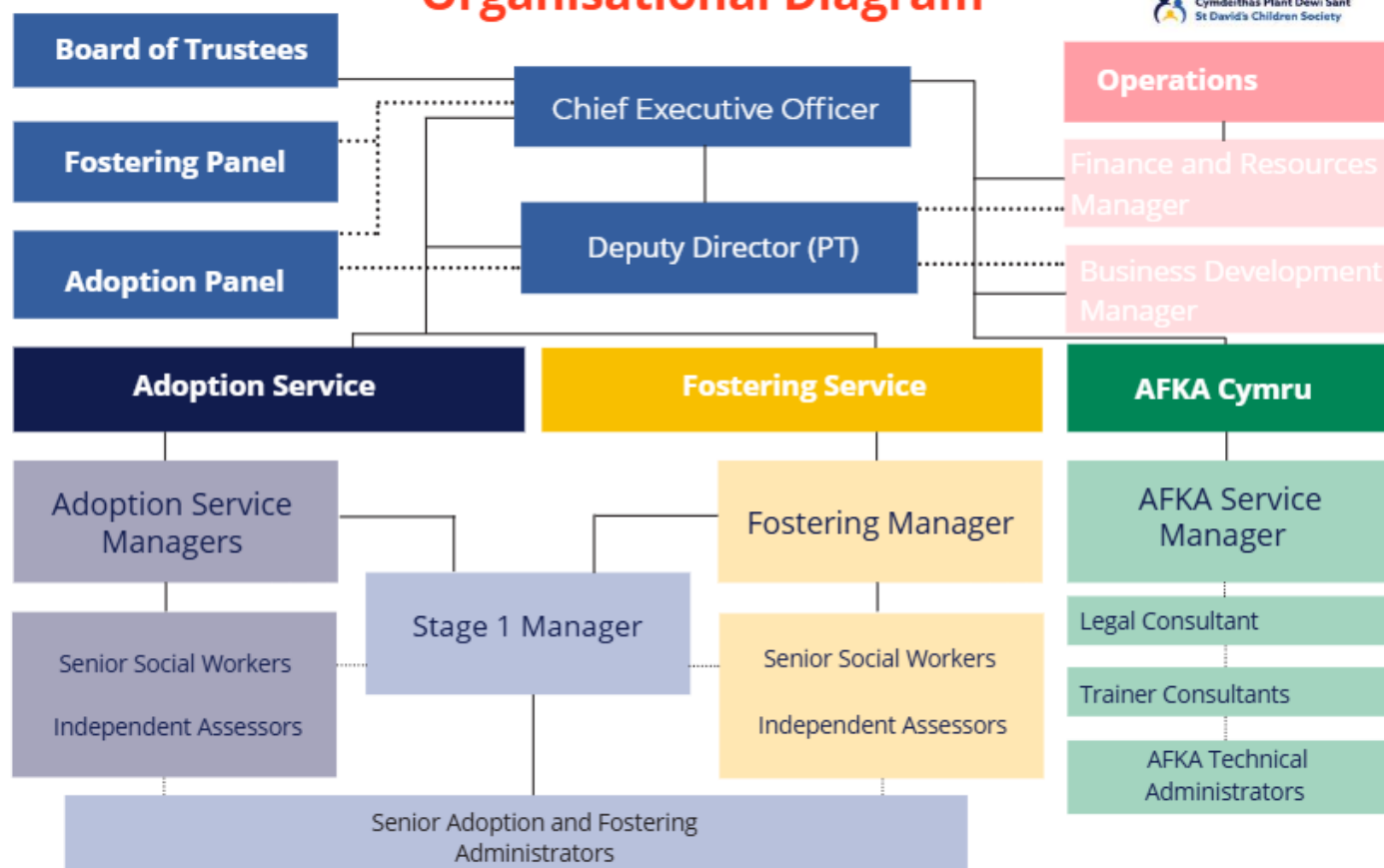
AFKA CYMRU

The staff at St David's are our most important asset. We are proud to have a diverse team of professionals who are skilled and committed to their work and who offer a supportive and welcoming environment to all.

As a registered charity our work is governed by our Board of Trustees, our senior leadership team is supported by a management team made up of service managers, a Finance and Resource manager and Business Development manager. Our staff teams include senior social workers, trainer consultants, a Stage 1 Manager, and technical and senior administrators.

Staff wellbeing is core to our work and we consistently seek to ensure our staff are supported in helping children and families achieve the best possible outcomes through adoption and permanency arrangements.

WHAT WE OFFER

St David's Children Society has been finding families for vulnerable children in Wales for over 80 years. None of our work would be possible without the skilled, dedicated and committed staff of St David's.

While working for St David's you will receive a competitive package, some of which includes

- Contributory Pension Scheme (including optional pension salary sacrifice)
- 25 days Annual Leave (Pro Rata for Part Time)

Your professional development is important to us and we support the Continued Professional Development of our staff by providing a selection of training to support staff in their roles. We will also consider individual staff requests for training and development.

Equality, Diversity and Inclusion

St David's is committed to the principles of equal opportunity in employment. We value people as individuals with diverse opinions, cultures, lifestyles and circumstances. We actively support diversity and inclusion and ensure that all our staff are valued and treated with dignity and respect.

St David's is part of the Disability Confident Employer Scheme. This is a nationally recognised accreditation scheme designed to encourage employers to recruit and retain disabled people and those with health conditions. As Disability Confident Employer we wish to demonstrate our commitment to equality for people with different needs in the work place and to inclusivity.

APPLICANT INFORMATION

We aim to ensure that every applicant is treated fairly. The information you provide in your application form is the only information we will use in deciding whether or not you will be shortlisted for the selection process. Your application form is therefore very important and the following advice is designed to help you to complete it as effectively as possible.

Your application form should be filled in as completely and as clearly as possible so that we can consider all applicants on the same basis.

Person Specification

The person specification is the list of criteria or requirements regarded as necessary for the post. To be considered for interview you need to fulfil the points of the person specification, demonstrating your abilities by telling us about your experience, skills and knowledge.

Shortlisting

After the closing date, the application forms are read very carefully to see how each person's skills and experience relate to the skills and experience of the person specification. Applicants who meet these requirements are shortlisted for interview. Only information contained in the application will be considered in making the decision to shortlist.

Interviews

An interview panel will ask each candidate questions covering the relevant criteria, to allow you to expand on your application and show how you meet the essential requirements of the post. Depending on the role, you may be asked to complete a task or presentation during the interview process.

You will also have opportunity to ask any questions about the role and working in one of St David's Children Society services at the end of the interview.

The interview panel members keep a record of their assessment of applications so that the reason for their decision is clear and consistent.
